MED 100: 110-hours EMT-B course

This is the required course for anyone seeking to become a certified Emergency Medical Technician—Basic (EMT-B). The course is based on the Department of Transportation's 1994 EMT-Basic national curriculum.

MED 103: SIMMAN

Class for Medical NCO's to become qualified operators. Training Support Centers in USAREUR have SIMMANs to assist Commanders in training and testing Soldiers and Medics. This course is required before signing out the equipment.

MED 104: 24 Hour Refresher Course

This is used for sustainment of NREMT-B and is recommended once every two years. The US Army EMS Office does not require a formal course to meet refresher requirements.

MED 106: CLS/Combat Lifesaver

Soldiers receive training in enhanced first aid procedures. This training serves as a bridge between the self-aid/buddy-aid training given to all soldiers during basic training and the medical training given to MOS 68W, Combat Medic.

MED 105: Combat medic advanced skills training

Tactical Combat Casualty care is the recognized standard for care in the combat and tactical environments. The course identifies the differences between the civilian standard of care versus care on the battlefield, challenging students to learn and apply different treatment modalities.

NREMT Re-registration Requirements

CPR

- Current certification in Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) at the healthcare provider level or higher. Must be current through re-certification date.

Refresher Training

- Complete a formal State/Army approved EMT refresher course or complete 24 hours of continuing education (CE) equivalency training. You cannot utilize more than 10 hours of distance learning as CE equivalency.

48 Hours Additional Continuing Education

- Training may be in any topic area at the EMT-B level or higher.
- No more than 24 hours may be the same topic area.
- No more than 24 hours of this requirement may be met through distance learning.

Skills Validation

- May be completed through an established Quality Assurance/Quality Inspection program. May be completed through direct observation testing. (i.e. All-Skills testing).
- U.S. Army EMS has authorized ACMS-VT Table VIII to be utilized as an acceptable alternate method of skills validation.
